

Since 2008, Marcel Tremblay has been a member of the Board of Directors and Chairman of the Audit Committee of the Société de transport de Montréal.

Since 2001, Mr. Tremblay has also been a member of the Executive Committee and a City Councillor for Notre-Dame-de-Grâce District of Côte-des-Neiges/Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Borough. As a member of the Executive Committee of the Ville de Montréal, he is responsible for intercultural relations, Parc Jean-Drapeau, communications and special events. Previously, he served as a member of the Environment Committee and the Speaker's Committee of the Communauté métropolitaine de Montréal.

Marcel Tremblay began his career in teaching and served as an elementary school principal. This is certainly why he has long worked with Participaction, an organization with the mission to favour a "movement" that urges and encourages Canadians to move more.

He imitated an educational camps project to counter school abandonment. These camps trained no fewer than 120 young people in the food and grocery industry. The project was carried out with the cooperation of the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW).

Mr. Tremblay is strongly involved in the organizing of Montréal's Italian Week, which increasingly is becoming a major popular activity, in which Montrealers of Italian origin appropriate their city and share their heritage with their fellow citizens.
