## RIDE FOR FREE

**Children aged 11 and under** can travel for free at all times while accompanied by a person aged 14 or older who is supervising them. The accompanying person must have a valid and validated ticket. Maximum 5 children aged 6 to 11.

**65 and over:** Residents of the agglomeration of Montréal ride for free within Zone A with the Free 65+, All Modes A, fare.
